

# Educational Excursion's Report 2024

## Department of Geography

The Department of Geography has organised an educational excursion with the students of UG Semesters V, III & I on/from 09.01.2024 to 12.01.2024. Total 32 Students along with Three Teaching Staff actively participated in this excursion. The destination was The Sundarbans, West Bengal, India.

The Sundarbans is intersected by a complex network of tidal waterways and small islands of salt-tolerant mangrove forests. Sundarbans, the home to the largest mangrove forest in the world and it has rich biodiversity. It is seated on a delta formed by the confluence of three famous rivers- The Ganges, The Meghna and The Brahmaputra in the Bay of Bengal. Sundarbans is awarded with the prestigious title, "World Heritage Site" by UNESCO.

The students visited several parts of Sundarbans like- Gosaba Hamilton Bungalow & Beacon Bungalow, Pakhiralay Bird Sanctuary, Dobanki Tiger Reserve Camp, Sajnekhali Wildlife Sanctuary and Jharkhali Tiger Rescue Centre. They also enriched by amazing variety of wide range of Flora and Fauna, the Royal Bengal Tiger and other threatened species such as Estuarine crocodile. The students also conducted their Household Survey at Pakhiralay village to collect various types of socio-economic data to analysis the socio-economic status of the village.

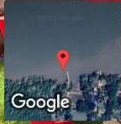
