
Section A: Plan of action chalked out by the IQAC in the beginning year towards quality enhancement (attach separate sheet if required):

Plans are chalked out for renew of registration of alumni association and selection of office bearers of the same alongwith formation of Parent-Teacher association. Due to paucity of non-teaching staff in different sections, necessary steps are to be taken to fill up vacant non-teaching posts on permanent basis or at least casual basis. One health check up center is planned to be set up in the college campus for benefits of the students. Installation of CCTV, sending proposal to the state Govt. for financial assistance for construction of modern canteen system, heighten of the boundary wall and renovation of office building, signing MoU with neighbouring college Aghore Kamini Prakash Chandra Mahavidyalaya, Bengai, purchasing of apparatus for dept. of Physics and Chemistry and repair of aqua-guard have been planned.

1. Activities reflecting the goals and objectives of the College:

The goal of the Institution has always been to focus on generating quality education at the graduate level especially for students belonging to the rural areas surrounding the College with an emphasis on empowerment of women and the backward classes and tribes. It is notable that a large number of the College students hail from the adjoining tribal area and an equally large number, both male and female, belong to the minority section. The aim of the College is to spread the ambit of higher education as many of the young learners are also first generation learners.



The College is spread over an area of 9.96 acres situated in a rural area. It is a grant-in-aid college affiliated to the University of Burdwan. The College is recognized by UGC under 2(f) and 12(B) in 1963. The College in the session 2015-2016, has 3833 students out of whom 2165 are male and 1668 are female. There are a total of 2107 General category students of out whom Male students are 1157 and female students are 950. There are 908 students belonging to the Scheduled Caste category, of whom 554 are male and 354 are female. The Scheduled Tribe category has 102 students, of whom 64 are male and 38 female. There are a total of 382 students belonging to the other backward classes of whom 201 are male, 181 are female. The Muslim minority category has 334 students of whom were 201 are male and 181 are female. The College has witnessed a pass percentage of about 74.7% in B.A Honours and 28.5% in B.A General. On the other hand students of 45.5% in B.Sc Honours and 62.5% in B.Sc General are passed.

The courses offer by the College to the students are in consonance with the mission and goals of the Institution. The College provides flexibility and wide range of programme options and students are given adequate opportunities to opt for the combination of subjects of their choice and aptitude.
